IBEW 688 Officers will be held Tuesday, July 14, 2020

CenturyLink Mansfield Unit will be held Thursday, July 23, 2020

CenturyLink Greenville, Sydney, Eaton will be held Wednesday, July 8th, 2020.

#### Officers Take Office:

Newly Elected Officers will take office at their regularly scheduled meetings in August. No Member may be a candidate for more than one office. Anyone nominated to more than one office must choose the office for which they will be a candidate.

Nominations will proceed in the order of offices as they are listed in the IBEW Constitution whose term of office shall be three (3) years.

In order to be nominated, a member must have a minimum of two (2) years of continuous good standing in Local Union No. 688. Good standing means that the member is current in

the payment of dues and has been for the two (2) years preceding the nominations.

According to the Bylaws of Local Union No. 688, Article III, Section 8e, no apprentice shall be eligible to hold office in the Local Union. Apprentices may seek office provided they become a journeyman by Tuesday, July 14, 2020.

An election judge and tellers will be appointed at the close of nominations. None of these may be a candidate for any office.

## Good of the Union



Chris May, Owner of PCR Restorations, Inc. and Lehr Awning Co., is the President of Mansfield Southwest Baseball at Sterkel Park, and we have worked on this project for several years now. Former Local Union 688 President, William Thompson began work on this project with apprentice Tory Gorka back in 2017 installing the underground PVC feeding this new pole style building. Recent retiree. Gaylord Rice Jr. also had his hands involved in this project. So, it is a great honor that I can finish this project that has been ongoing for years.

This project originally began as a dream of Chris's many years ago. With donations from the citizens of who have fond memories of playing at these fields as children themselves, proceeds from the concession stand, and volunteer's in the community have allowed this dream to become a reality. Menard's

donated half the cost of the building material, and volunteers backed out of the construction, so it has taken quite some time to for this project to get to this point.

We are in need of volunteers to complete the project, as well as some equipment to make it happen. We have a digging to do to extend the underground closer structure, and connect each end to their final locations. We will need 4-5 guys to help pull in feeder conductors (3 - 3/0 CU and 1 - # 6 CU) as the run is 650' long. We have around 700' of conduit to run for power and lighting. There will be 2 cages in the building with 10 LED High lights as well emergency and exit lighting per code.

I would like to have enough volunteer's to be able to knock this out in a Saturday, but I realize everone is busy with their lives, but may want to
